This month's fish-a-long:  
Saturday, July 12, 2003

**Carp Fishing**, Blue Lake Regional Park, 20500 N.W. Marine Drive, Fairview, OR. Blue Lake Regional Park is located between Marine Drive and Sandy Boulevard off Northeast 223rd Ave. From Interstate 84, take the Fairview Exit (14) and go north on 207th Avenue to Sandy Boulevard. Turn right onto Sandy and travel east to 223rd and turn left. Proceed north to Blue Lake Road and the park. The park is open from 8:00 am to legal sunset. Admission is \$3 per car or free with an annual Metro Parks pass. Check out [www.metro-region.org](http://www.metro-region.org) for more information about the lake.

Meet at 9:00 am at the concrete statues at the park. You will be sight fishing for carp (wading). Be prepared also to fish for whatever else is in Blue Lake in case the carp aren't cooperative. Flies that should work include: a black wooly worm, a black leech, a black wooly bugger, or a crayfish pattern. Remember that you want your fly to sink to the bottom right in front of a feeding carp.

Other fish that you might encounter at Blue Lake are trout, smallmouth bass and other pan fish. Callibaetis nymphs and leech patterns should work well. Contact Carmen if you need further advice and to let her know if you are planning to attend. I'm not able to as I am getting wisdom teeth pulled the day before. Have fun.

## Fly Lines
